



Dear Students and Parents / Carers

Examinations – Summer Series 2022

Please see your accompanying timetable for dates of your forthcoming Summer external exams and the booklet called 'JCQ Instructions for Candidates'. You must keep both in a safe place as you will need to refer to them in order to prepare for your exams.

You should report to the main hall 10 minutes prior to the start time of each exam, for an exam preparation meeting.

All equipment will be provided by the Academy, including calculators. You may use your own black biro if you wish but it must be **black** ink. Any other materials, including erasers, correction pens/fluid, gel pens, notebooks etc., are not allowed.

IMPORTANT:

Mobile phones and valuables (including watches) should be left at home on exam days as bags and coats are not allowed in the exam room. Examination regulations are very strict on items that may be taken into exam rooms and operate a no tolerance policy on mobile phones, ipods, smartwatches and any other electronic devices – even if they are switched off.

Furthermore, students are NOT ALLOWED TO WEAR A WATCH in the exam room. You must either leave your watch outside or take it off and display it on your desk. Failure to follow these regulations could lead to disqualification.

Before you go into the exam room you must check your seat number on the seating plan displayed near your exam room. Remember, you must **enter the exam room in silence** as you will be under exam conditions as soon as you walk into the room until your papers have been collected and you have left the room.

There is a range of important exam information available on the Academy website which includes the exam timetable, JCQ information for students, correspondence etc. Please take time to look through this with your parents/carers.

It is the aim of Oasis Academy Immingham to make the examination experience as stress-free and successful as possible, for all students. If there is anything you do not understand or any question that has not been addressed, please ask Miss Hanson or Mr Gallafent in the first instance.
