

Through the study of geography, we give students knowledge of diverse people, places and environments. This knowledge will allow students to connect to, and understand their responsibilities within, their local, national and global contexts. In particular, our curriculum offers the opportunity for students to:

- Access and contribute to critical debates and issues at a local, national and global level such as climate change, sustainability and inequality
- Compare and contrast different places attitudes, values and beliefs from across the world through the study of a variety of people and places
- Develop their investigative skills through fieldwork which enables them to evaluate local issues by gathering and presenting data
- Analyse, explain and understand the world in powerful ways through understanding concepts such as diversity, change, interdependence, space and place
- Communicate in sophisticated ways including through maps, numerical and quantitative skills and writing nuanced judgements at length
- Use case studies from around the world to illuminate, evaluate and apply abstract ideas to different contexts
- Engage in fieldwork to develop an understanding of a geographical enquiry and independently generate, present and analyse data
